

How to get a Self Rating

When and how does a player get a Self Rating?

If a player does not have a computer rating from the USTA, the player must self-rate before entering a USTA league program.

1. Go to tennislink.usta.com

- If you do not have a tennislink account, you will need to set up one. It is free and does not require a USTA membership. Click on “create an account.”

2. On the navigation bar select USTA League. Below the heading “Find NTRP Rating Info” click the “self-rate” button. There may also be a link to the right under “Quick Links” and/or at the top of the page the link “Get a self rating without a USTA membership.”

3. Complete the questionnaire honestly and completely. You can review the NTRP guide attached. Tennislink will come back immediately with a self rating. If you think the rating should be higher or lower there will be a link on that page that says “appeal self rating.” That will take you to a more in depth questionnaire. Please complete all the questions to the best of your ability and submit the form.

4. This appeal goes to a committee at the Southern level for a review. It takes about 14 business days for the appeal to be returned. It will be emailed to you.

5. **Alternative Way** : You can also get a self rating by registering for a team, a player will need a USTA Membership number, the team number and a major credit card. When “Register for a Team” is clicked, the player will be directed to the self-rate questionnaire.
